

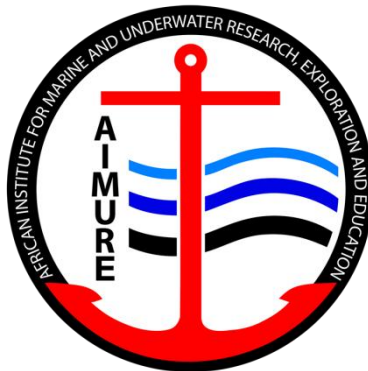

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1. Background

In a special meeting held at Cape Town on 12 September 2012, the African Institute for Marine and Underwater Research, Exploration and Education (the AIMURE), a non-profit organisation, was established. The establishment was made effective by approval and acceptance of the Constitution of the AIMURE by its management committee.

The Constitution was sent to the Department of Social Development for registration of the new organisation. This registration took place on the 8 October 2012 with registration number 114-048 NPO. Only on 4 June 2013 the AIMURE got hold of the official Certificate of Registration after multiple efforts to obtain this document.

2.2 Section B: Major achievements

The AIMURE was able to take a couple of major steps forward to achieve the goals as described in the constitution, but also experienced some drawbacks.

Analyses of the metal finds from the 'Haarlem' test excavation are still outstanding due to various reasons. These include a backlog caused by the Covid pandemic and the rebuilding of laboratories at the University of Johannesburg. Although it was expected that analyses would have taken place around June-July 2023, the responsible scientist was not in a position to do so. Through the efforts of Chairman Dr Master, other scientists were approached to undertake the necessary analyses but only limited feedback has been received to date.

Another article, dealing with fossil finds from the shipwrecks of the *Oosterland* and *Waddinxveen* (1697) in Table Bay, is awaiting finalization by the second author. An article on geophysical surveys applied on the assumed wrecksite of *Haarlem* is in the writing stage.

The CEO is currently writing a book on the search for the shipwreck of *Haarlem*. This is going to be complementary to his 2017 Unisa publication *The Haarlem Shipwreck (1647): The Origins of Cape Town*. This new book will include new historical information, aspects of fieldwork as well as analyses of the recovered materials, as well as a section on legislation and Cultural Resource Management.

The CEO also completed the manuscript for an historical novel entitled *Anno 1647. How Cape Town began*. A Dutch translation, *Anno 1647. Hoe Kaapstad ontstond*, has also been prepared. This story focuses on the life of Andreas Felten, a German soldier who was on board *Haarlem* and later formed part of the crew that stayed behind on the shore of Table Bay to salvage as much as was possible from the wreck. The manuscripts have been offered to several publishers. To date, positive responses have been received from German publishers August von Goethe Literaturverlag and Weimarer Schiller Presse. These, however, follow a hybrid publication model, which seems to be the norm nowadays. For this publication, an input from the author of Euro 14,674 (August von Goethe) to Euro 7,220 (Weimarer Schiller Presse) has been quoted. Publishing house Calidris, with offices in Sweden, Norway, Finland, Portugal, Spain, the UK and the Netherlands is interested in a Dutch publication. Its quote amounts to Euro 3,995.

Television producer Mr Johann Abrahams and the CEO re-assessed a previous application to the National Film and Video Foundation (NFVF) and re-applied. If granted, the application may allow for the production of an international documentary on the 'Haarlem' Project.

Chairman Dr Master organized a one day symposium on the 'Haarlem' Project at the School of Geosciences at the University of the Witwatersrand on Friday 15 November 2024. Guest speakers included Ms Naazneen Khan, whose presentation focussed on the various legal aspects related to the 'Haarlem' Project. AIMURE Chairman Dr Master reported on a first analysis of some combined copper-lead sheeting from the presumed wrecksite which seems to support the correct location. The CEO presented two lectures. One dealt with a general background history of the Dutch East India Company (VOC) and the second one on the *Haarlem* especially, with attention to background history and the search for the shipwreck. The overall importance of this project for the history of South Africa was emphasized by the opening lecture that was presented by Prof. Jane Carruthers, former Editor-in-chief of the South African Journal of Science.
